The Los Angeles Convention Center (LACC) is recognized as a highly rated facility in terms of safety and security programs supporting its clients and visitors.

While the current *H1N1 flu* situation is fairly recent in its onset, the LACC has a longstanding collaborative relationship with the infectious disease control community, and has instituted a set of measures designed to track influenza movement and progress, with cleaning and education standards designed to limit transmission.

The following is an abbreviated set of partnerships in place with the LACC to monitor and control the potential for transmission.
